NOT IMPORTANT	<p>DELEGATE</p> <p>Some phone calls or e-mails, requests for other people, errands, meetings, interruptions.</p> <p>What's urgent but less important, delegate to others.</p>	<p>ELIMINATE</p> <p>Distractions, social media, junk e-mails, time wasters.</p> <p>What's neither urgent nor important, don't do it at all.</p>

PRESENT PERFECT TENSE USAGE

Talking about situations that started in the past and are still continuing in the present

Completed actions in the past if they were frequent actions (the time involved in which the action took place has not ended)

Talking about an action completed in the past which has a present result

It's widely used in news reports when introducing a new topic in their columns with future reference

Guardian **HP: 80** **AP: 30**

Guardians are a team's defenders, protecting their teammates from damage (losing **HP**). They're super strong but can't use their powers as often as other characters.

COLLABORATIVE



ONE WITH NATURE – Advanced Power
Everyone on the Guardian's team gets a hint on a question.

-30 AP ✓



FIRST AID – Basic Power
The Guardian gains 1 HP for each level they have, but always gains at least 5 HP.

-10 AP



TRACK – Intermediate Power
The Guardian gets a hint on a question.

-15 AP



PROTECT 1 – Basic Power
The Guardian can take up to 10 damage instead of their teammate, receiving only 80% of the initial damage.

STEALTH – Intermediate Power
The Guardian may have an extra day for an assignment.

-25 AP



PROTECT 3 – Advanced Power
The Guardian can take up to 30 damage instead of their teammate, receiving only 50% of the initial damage.

-20 AP ✓



PROTECT 2 – Intermediate Power
The Guardian can take up to 20 damage instead of their teammate, receiving only 65% of the initial damage.

-15 AP ✓



CAMOUFLAGE – Advanced Power
Everyone on the Guardian's team gets an extra day for an assignment.

-30 AP ✓



EAGLE EYES – Basic Power
The Guardian gets a 10 minute video meeting with the teacher.

Mage **HP: 30** **AP: 50**

Mages are powerhouses! They can use their powers most often, but they have fewer **HP** to lose before they fall. Mages replenish Action Points so their team can use powers as often as possible.

	PSIONIC AURA – Basic Power All team members, except Mages, gain 7 AP.	-35 AP	✓
	ELEMENTAL AFFINITY – Basic Power The Mage gets an extra hour to turn in an assignment.	-20 AP	
	PSIONIC FLARE – Advanced Power A teammate, who isn't a Mage, replenishes all of their AP.	-40 AP	✓
	ALTERED DESTINY – Intermediate Power A fallen teammate (other than the Mage) can reroll the cursed die but must accept the new outcome.	-15 AP	✓
	LEAP OF FAITH – Basic Power The Mage gets a 10 minute video meeting with the teacher.	-10 AP	
	KY'S INTUITION – Advanced Power Everyone on the Mage's team gets an extra hour to turn in an assignment.	-40 AP	✓
	PSIONIC SHIELD – Intermediate Power The Mage prevents the loss of HP to themselves (costs 3 AP per 1 HP).		

Healer **HP: 50** **AP: 35**

Healers are the most balanced of the three characters in terms of **HP** and **AP**. It's their job to heal their teammates when their health get low to prevent them from falling (which would cause your team to lose **HP!**)

COLLABORATIVE



RESTORATION – Intermediate Power

When a teammate (not including the Healer) falls to 0 HP, they avoid all penalties and come back to life with 1 HP.

NATURE'S GUIDANCE – Basic Power

The Healer gets a 10 minute video meeting with the teacher.

-10 AP



SPRITE ALLIANCE – Advanced Power

The Healer's team may work together on an individual assignment.

-30 AP



HEAL 1 – Basic Power

A teammate gains 10 HP.

-15 AP



HEAL 2 – Intermediate Power

A teammate gains 20 HP.

-20 AP



HEALING CIRCLE – Advanced Power

All team members, other than the Healer, gain 15 HP.

-30 AP



CRYSTAL GAZE – Intermediate Power

The Healer may work with a partner on an individual assignment.

-25 AP



MEDITATION – Basic Power

The Healer gets an extra hour to turn in an assignment.

-20 AP



HEAL 3 – Advanced Power

A teammate gains 30 HP.

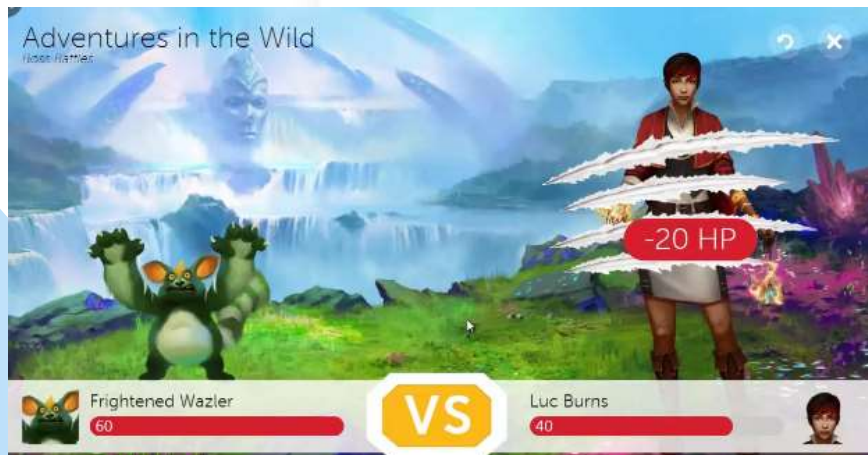


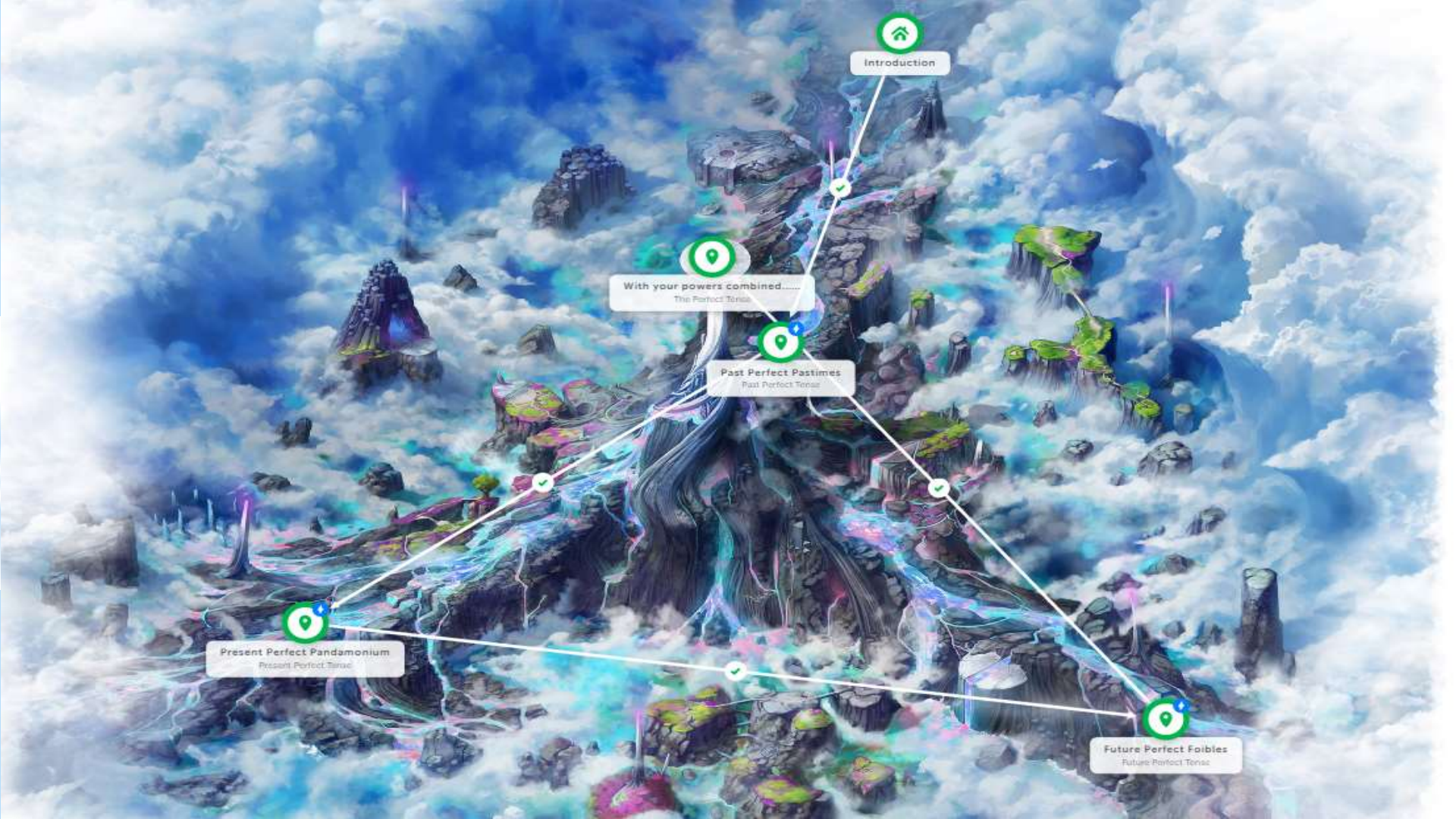

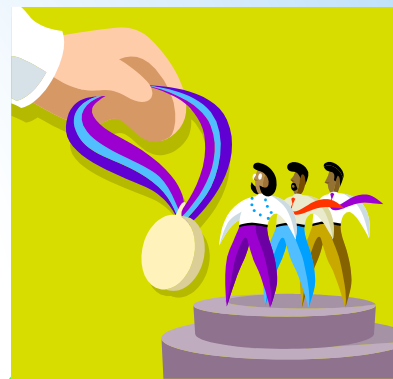
